He retired from the position in 2005. Mr. Fischer was a skilled drummer who played in many local bands, including Penn Lucy, the Delmonicos, Bob Brady & the Con Chords and with Bruce Westcott. While with Penn Lucy, he opened for The Who in the early '70s at Merriweather Post Pavilion.

He was also inducted into the Musicians Hall of Fame in 2005 for his drumming accomplishments.

Mr. Fischer was an avid golfer and spent much of his retirement enjoying the sport and playing in several competitions.

Mr. Fischer is survived by two brothers, Earnest Fischer of Essex and James Fischer of Dundalk.
